The Breed Pinto

The diversity of the Pinto breed can be seen in the number of recognized outcross breeds, which are separated into different types by their classifications. The Pinto is separated into five different classifications: stock, hunter, pleasure, saddle and utility. We also include ponies and minis. For more information on registering your Pinto, visit the Registration Page.

Size

The Pinto comes five different classifications - miniature, miniature B, pony and horse and utility horse.

A miniature Pinto is any equine measuring 34 inches or less and a miniature B Pinto is any equine measuring more than 34 inches to 38 inches. A Pinto pony is any equine measuring more than 38 inches to 56 inches. A Pinto horse® is an equine measuring more than 56 inches or 14 hands. A Pinto utility horse is an equine possessing Gypsy or Drum breeding, regardless of height.



Type

Horses and ponies and utility horses are classified by type. The four horse/pony types include stock, hunter, pleasure and saddle.



Stock - a western horse of predominantly Quarter Horse or Paint breeding and conformation



Hunter - an English horse generally including Thoroughbred and approved European Warmblood breeding and conformation



Pleasure - a horse usually of Arabian, Andalusian or Morgan breeding and conformation



Saddle - a gaited horse, possibly Saddlebred, Hackney or Tennessee Walker breeding and conformation

The two Utility types include Gypsy and Drum.




Gypsy - a horse of predominantly Gypsy Cob or Vanner breeding. Conformation displays a heavy build and short to moderate frame.

Drum - a horse of Gypsy crossbreeding with other draft type breeds or full blood draft type breeds. Conformation displays a larger, taller frame.

Color

A Pinto horse® must have four square inches of cumulative white in the qualifying zone and underlying pink skin. The requirement is modified with the size of the equine requiring only three square inches for ponies and two square inches for miniatures. Any Pinto that is registered with an approved outcross breed and has documented color on the outcross papers is eligible for registration.



The equines that do not meet the color requirement, but have at least two or more Pinto characteristics (blue eyes; leg white above the knee or hock; white or multi-colored hooves; collective white in the eligible zones, but not enough to qualify for color; pink skin), or are registered in an approved outcross registry, are eligible for our Solid Registry.

Pattern

The two color patterns are the Tobiano and the Overo.

The Tobiano coat appears to be white with large flowing spots of color, often overlapping. Spots of color typically originate from the head, chest, flank and buttock, often including the tail.

The Overo coat appears to be a colored horse with white markings. Spots of white appear to be jagged and usually originate on the animal's side or belly spreading toward the neck, tail, legs and back. White almost never crosses the back.

What's the Difference between Paint?

A frequently asked question about the Pinto is "what's the difference between an American Paint horse and a Pinto horse®?" American Paint horses are limited to registered bloodlines of Paint, American Quarter Horse and Thoroughbred horses, whereas the Pinto can be from an array of bloodlines including the Arabian, American Saddlebred, American Miniature Horse, Tennessee Walking Horse and American Shetland Pony to name a few. The PtHA® does not accept Appaloosa or Mule breeding and/or characteristics except for non-characteristic Appaloosas.


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Pinto Youth Organization

10 Signs Your Horse Needs a Dental Exam

Equine injuries such as wounds or soft tissue swellings are typically easy to recognize. Problems that aren't visible to the eye, however, can go unnoticed. Take dental issues, for example. These often go undetected because the cheek teeth can't be readily seen and are dangerous to examine without proper equipment.

There are some subtle clinical signs, however, that can alert the owner about a dental or mouth problem, so it's important he or she be on the lookout for those and schedule routine dental exams. A full examination requires sedating the horse, keeping his mouth open with a speculum and using a strong light source and a dental mirror to visualize all of the cheek teeth. It also involves manually checking for loose teeth or other issues.

Some conditions are unique to either the growing or geriatric horse, while others can occur at any age. The following are the most commonly seen signs of dental problems and their possible causes.

Dropping feed

Sharp enamel points from normal chewing wear can cause a normally fastidious horse to change how he eats, resulting in dropped feed. Other causes might include loose or fractured teeth, periodontal disease, malocclusions, foreign bodies, and masses in the mouth. Many horses normally drop feed if they look around while eating or if they are fast eaters.

Suddenly not eating either hay or grain

In horses younger than 5, pain before, during, or after losing a baby tooth can make chewing unpleasant and difficult. In horses older than 20, loose teeth can make chewing difficult.

Dropping clumps of hay (quidding)

This can be secondary to pain from sharp enamel points in any age horse, for example, or in older horses it can be a result of a decreased chewing surface area.

Dental Exam Cont.

Eating with the head tilted to one side

Mouth pain, such as from sharp enamel points on one side of the mouth might cause the horse to try to adjust his eating pattern by turning or tilting his head.

Salivating more than normal

The horse's body might increase saliva production in an attempt to lubricate something sharp or possibly make it easier to chew and swallow his feed, again in response to pain.

Losing weight

This can potentially occur at any age due to a dental or mouth problem. The most common clinical cases of weight loss involve aged horses that are unable to eat long-stemmed hay because of diminished grinding capacity.

Fussy with the bridle; resistant on one side more than another

Pain within the mouth can cause the horse to react negatively when asked to work.

Soft or hard asymmetric swellings

Young horses can develop normal symmetric bony swellings, called eruption cysts, in response to the eruption (emergence) of the cheek teeth. If the swellings are asymmetric or the horse reacts with pain on palpation, then consider them abnormal.

One-sided nasal discharge with an odor

Up to four of the six upper cheek teeth communicate with (are connected to) the sinuses within the horse's head. Abscessation of any of these teeth can lead to a secondary sinus infection. Discharge from the infected sinus will drain out the nostril. It is usually yellow and has an odor you might be able to smell as soon as you walk into the barn or stall.

Dental Exam Cont.

Mouth odor

Mouth odor comes from food packed between the cheek teeth or fractured tooth fragments.

A horse owner can detect these signs easily by routinely checking his or her horse's head for any abnormalities and watching the animal eat. Regular dental examinations per-formed by a veterinarian will also alert the owner of any problems to be watching for.

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

Foals and horses up to 3 years of age:

- 1. Starting at 60 days of age we recommend rotating dewormers at 8 week interval
- a. Start with either fenbendazole or pyrantel followed with ivermectin alternating every other 8 weeks until 3 years of age

Horses that are new or returning to a farm:


- 1. Ivermectin + Praziquantel when introduced to the farm
- 2. Perform a FEC 8 week's post dewormer and enroll in program
 - a. If eggs are present begin a Panacur Power Pack
 - b. Recheck FEC 2 weeks after Panacur Power Pack



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VACCINATION RECOMMENDATIONS

The recommendations listed in the table are for foals and weanlings of mares who were appropriately vaccinated for the indicated disease prior to foaling. Adult horses should follow the schedule shown in the Booster column.

Disease	1st Dose	2nd Dose	Booster
Tetanus	5 months of age	4 weeks after 1st dose	Revaccinate Annually or after penetrating wound if more than 6 months since last vaccine
Encephalitis	5 months of age	4 weeks after 1st dose	Revaccinate annually (Spring)
Rabies	5 months of age	4 weeks after 1st dose	Revaccinate annually
West Nile Virus	5 months of age	4 weeks after 1st dose	Revaccinate semi-annually
Rhinopneumonitis	5 months of age	4 weeks after 1st dose	Revaccinate at 2-6 month intervals **
Influenza	5 months of age	4 weeks after 1st dose	Revaccinate at 2-6 month intervals **
Potomac Horse Fe- ver	5 months of age	4 weeks after 1st dose	Revaccinate at 4-6 month intervals
Strangles	5 months of age	4 weeks after 1st dose	Revaccinate annually
Rhinitis	5 months of age	4 weeks after 1st dose	Booster again at 8 weeks after initial and then Revaccinate annually

^{**}For horses transported off farms and frequently exposed to other horses we recommend boostering Influenza and Rhinopneumonitis every 2-3 months.

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

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
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
